

Watching Over Maaleh Levona

It is a thankless job. Hour after hour these men drive around the winding security roads of isolated communities. They are out there, running practice drills and giving of their own time for others, dealing with an element of fear, of potential danger... of responsibility. Scanning the roads, the hilltops, for suspicious movements, being constantly alert for signs of possible peril. The Emergency Response teams are volunteers who, in conjunction with the Israeli Army, help protect their communities from terrorism. They may not have the uniform. But they are out there, guarding God's children, protecting vulnerable communities from dangers that lurk in the mountains and valleys beyond.



It is not easy to live in Maale Levona. Maale Levona is located on a lone hilltop, just a few kilometers from Shiloh and Eli. Named for the ancient community of Levona, known to have been located along the Road of the Patriarchs, on the way from Shechem to Shiloh, Maale Levona overlooks the remains of an ancient community thought to be the original Levona. There are some 120 families in Maale Levona today, including over 250 children, all trying to maintain normal lives. But the relative isolation makes things difficult, makes them feel their vulnerability.

Yet these residents of Maale Levona make a tremendous effort to keep their community life rich and rewarding. They want their families to feel safe sleeping in their own homes, walking on their tree-lined streets, playing in their local parks. And in order to keep them safe, they need additional equipment, equipment that you can help them acquire.

- Maale Levona is an isolated community, feeling its vulnerability.
- Communities like Maale Levona depend upon the brave volunteers of their Rapid Response team to give them a feeling of safety and security.
