

Room For Everyone in Talmon

In March, 1989, five families settled on a hilly area, just 40 kilometers from Jerusalem, and established the community of Talmon. A year later there were thirteen and today there are 240 families, including 1,000 children. Sixty percent of the residents are second generation families from Judea, Samaria and Gush Katif, ensuring the pioneering atmosphere in this isolated community in the Benjamin area.

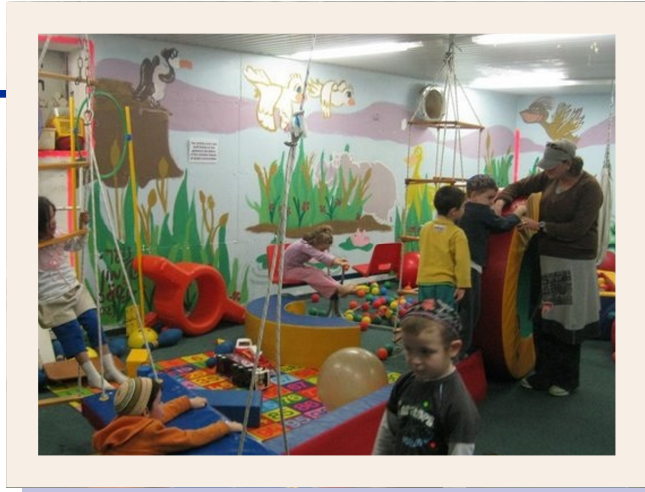
Talmon is a wonderful mix of ideology and quality of life and houses being built are snatched up as soon as they go on the market. Young families are moving in and the needs of the children have become a priority.

At the moment, the Day Care Center, for 85 small children, is housed in a two-floor building. The first floor is solely for the Day Care, but the second floor is shared with the community library. Forty five more children are currently being housed in five assorted mobile homes, resulting in inefficiency of care and service and sometimes even safety hazards. The authorities are threatening to take away their license if a more appropriate facility is not found. The most logical solution is to evict the library, giving the Day Care 40% more space on the second floor.

The most logical solution is not always the simplest and is definitely not cost-free. The people of Talmon would like to adapt this section of the second floor for the children according to all legal specifications.
